Telehandler Training Courses Edmonton - Employers are responsible for ensuring that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work proficiently utilizing telehandler equipment. The skill level of employees have to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that workers attain the needed level of ability. The level of responsibility of the individual must be considered when training is provided. Effective training would solve any deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training may be undertaken through in-house session or by hiring an external training provider. An assessment at the completion of the training period will determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

Local, federal and state/provincial regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of people, the lifting of suspended loads, the use of rotating machinery or using different attachments. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work site.

Inspection and maintenance

Similar to whichever equipment, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear sooner or later. Right maintenance is essential to ensuring safe operation of the telehandler machinery. Inspections and checks are essential to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators need to have machine-specific training to be able to rectify, monitor and prevent problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Workers require experience and competence in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be seriously viewed and complied with, taking into consideration such factors as environmental conditions in the work setting and frequency of use.

The responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the owner and the user of the machinery. Pre-use inspections are normally carried out by the user, whilst general maintenance is usually done by the telehandler owner.
